The Gouverneur Museum continues to receive genealogy inquiries and many visitors. Over 270 visited the Museum this year and another 472 visited the Gouverneur Museum Annex at the fairgrounds during fair week. New members continue to join and donations support our efforts to keep history alive and well in Gouverneur.

The Gouverneur Garden Club and museum volunteers again decorated for the Christmas holidays and Amy Cook was our featured exhibitor. Amy is a nature photographer and spends countless hours capturing wonderful wildlife photos. A reception was held and throughout the month many visited the exhibit and toured the museum.

In June, the museum had tables set up for Flag day in the Park, and then again for Arts in the Park. In August we participated in Antiques in the Park.
